A \$50 non-refundable weekly deposit is due at the time of registration to reserve your child's participation for each registered camp session.

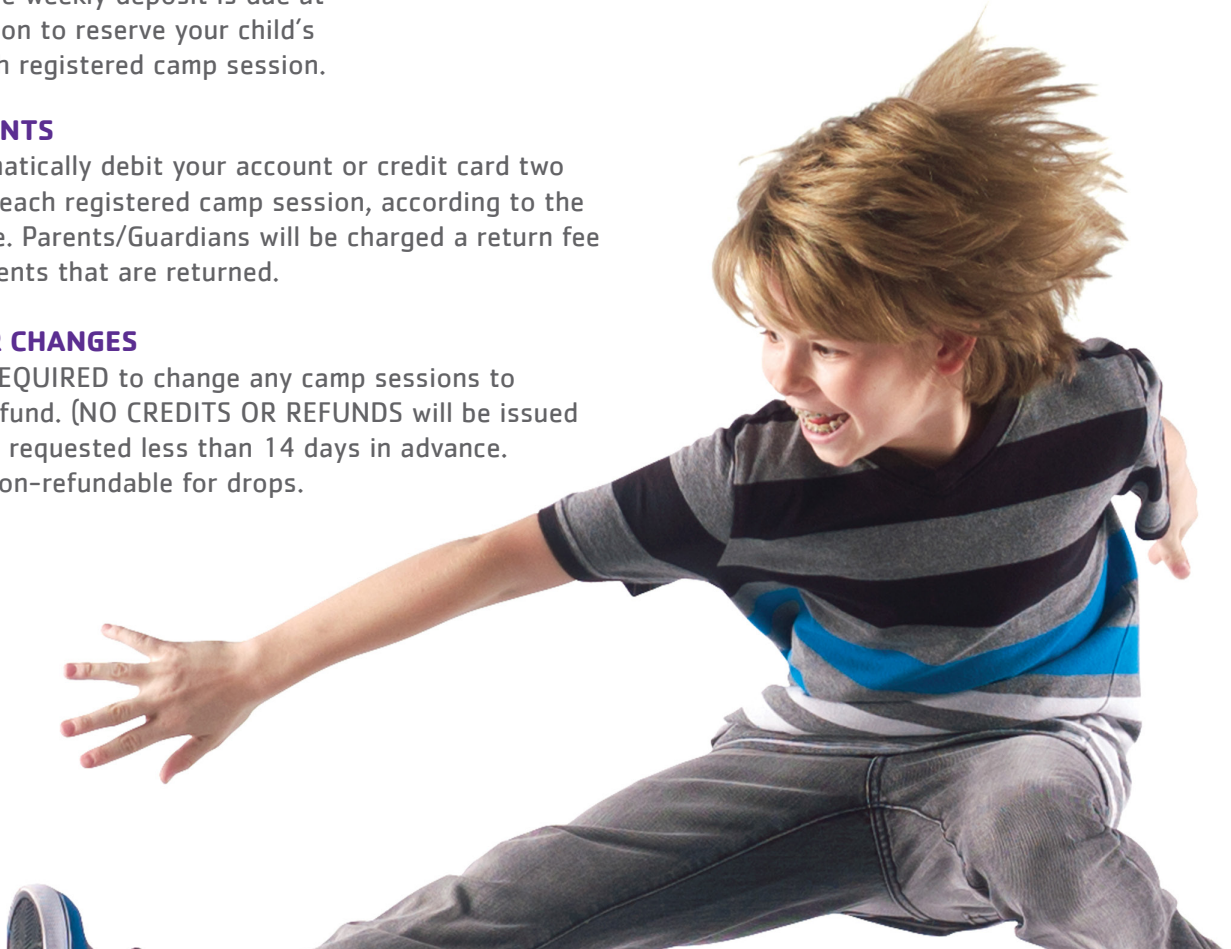
AUTOMATIC PAYMENTS
